ost parents take good care of their children. They make sure they have good food, adequate clothing and a safe place to live.

A Note to Parents

Looking after a child's physical needs is a major part of good parenting!

But what about your child's spiritual needs? This book will help your child develop a relationship with God. The teaching is not from any particular church or denomination – it is from God's Word, the Bible. This devotional book is designed to guide your child in his or her quiet time with God each day.

As your child reads this book, he or she will get to know God better and be challenged to live in a way that pleases Him. Your child will be encouraged to be obedient, respectful, kind and loving. He or she will learn character traits such as courage, thankfulness and contentment. Your child will also learn how to resist those who want him or her to do wrong and how to forgive others.

This book is written simply and clearly and includes fun activities. You might even enjoy working through the book together!

Encourage your child to have a quiet time with God each day. You will be helping establish good habits that will impact your child forever!

How to use this book!

God wants you to have time with Him every day! You do this when you read the Bible and pray. This book will help you. Here is what to do:

- Stop what you are doing. Get a pen or pencil. Take this book. Take your Bible if you have one.
- Sit in a quiet place. Ask God to help as you read in His Word today.
- Read. Start with #1 in this book. Read the Bible verses at the top of the first page. Read and do each part on both pages.
- Think about what you read. Is there something God wants you to do? Is there something you can thank God for?
- **Pray.** Ask God to help you obey Him.

 The prayer at the bottom of the page will help you.




On day four God made the sun, moon and stars. They would give light on earth.



Do you know about God



The one true God has great power. God made the world. He made you. He loves you very much! God is perfect. He wants you to live with Him in Heaven.



But there is a big problem. You were born wanting to do wrong things called sin. Things like telling lies or being mean make God unhappy. The Bible says, "For all have sinned..." (Romans 3:23). God has to punish sin. The punishment is to be away from God forever.



God made a way to forgive your sin. He sent His only Son, Jesus, to Earth as a baby. Jesus grew to be a man. He never sinned. But God punished Jesus for your sin! Jesus was nailed to a cross. He bled and died. This was God's plan.

Jesus died on the cross and was buried. On the third day God brought Jesus back to life. The Bible says, "...Christ died for our sins... he was raised on the third day..." (1 Corinthians 15:3-4). Jesus is alive in Heaven today.

Jesus died for you.

Now you can have your sins forgiven.

The Bible says, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved..." (Acts 16:31). You must believe—put your trust completely in Jesus, who died for you and came alive again.

When you believe in Him, He will forgive your sin and save you from the punishment you deserve. He will come and live in you by His Holy Spirit. He will help you turn from sin and help you follow Him in all you do. One day, you will go to live with God in His perfect home called Heaven.

Will you believe in Jesus to save you from sin right now?
